## *Brief* **HISTORY OF ANOINTED CHAPEL**

**Anointed Chapel Brampton, Ontario** is a Parish of The Redeemed Christian Church of God. RCCG is located in over 196 countries of the world with over 42,000 parishes all over the world. The parish came into existence with the vision of Pastor Olusegun Rotimi, the then Area Pastor of Anointed Area under North Province 12 in Nigeria. The General Overseer is Pastor E. A. Adeboye.

Anointed Chapel was registered Not-for-profit (Charity) Organization under the Canada Revenue Agency Charity Organizations Act in 2010.

The first Service held at the Loafer's Lake Recreation Centre on the 21st February 2010 under the leadership of Timothy and Abimbola Oyeyinka. It is also the sixth Parish they have been privileged to serve in this capacity. Within two weeks, the parish moved to 10 Nelson Street W in the downtown area of Brampton. Within three months, the parish moved again to bigger facility at 37 George Street North before moving to her newly purchased 1.3 Acre facility located at 1 Lowry Drive Brampton Ontario in 2014.

Anointed Chapel is part of RCCG Canada family with over 185 parishes in Canada under North America Operations and has birthed three other parishes of the RCCG, like House of Grace Georgetown, Wealthy Place Malton and Tabernacle of Favor Brampton and still counting.

Our Mission Statement is Giving Life and Meaning to the Total Man – 3 John 2.

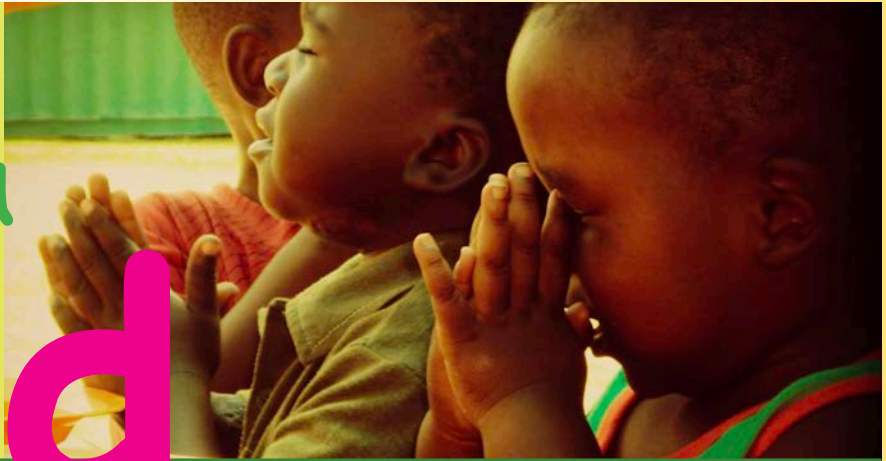

# Train up a child

*“Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it” (Proverbs 22:6 NKJV).*

From the scripture above, God is saying to parents it is their responsibility to teach or train their children in the ways of God. What does the word train mean? It means to teach and form by practice; to educate; to exercise; to discipline. To train a child also means to give instructions to that child in accordance to the child's personality with the intension of making the child reach his or her full potential in life.

Every child has talents and gifts. It is the responsibility of parents to spend time observing their children. When you observe a child, you will notice that the child likes certain things and might not like other things. You will notice that the child gravitates towards certain things. A child might find certain subjects easy while other subjects might be difficult. By the time all observations are combined, you will easily identify the child's strengths. The next step is to put strategies in place to ensure that the child excels at his/her strength. You also need to communicate your observation to that child. For example, you can say to the child, “I observe that you like mathematics and science, I think you will be good at Engineering”.

Looking at the bible verse, it says “train up a child”. We have looked at the word the word “train”. It is interesting to note that the word train was followed with up. I understand that if a parent does not spend time with the child, there are tendencies that the child would suffer loss. In the process of training a child, a parent tells the children right from wrong. This means that the parents should teach their children their values. If a parent does not spend time teaching the child what is right from what is wrong, the parent can be sure that the child would learn the world's value system. One thing you can be sure of is that the world will not teach your children the right values.

Parents should also teach the children how they should live, teach them how to handle finances, teach them how to handle relationships, teach them the values to look out for when choosing their friends. If you think that a particular friend will be a bad influence on the child, please explain your reason to the child based on the child's maturity level. Parents should be their children's biggest supporters and encouragers. It is extremely important that Parents find time to listen to what they have to say. It is in the place of listening to them that you understand their challenges and you can proffer solutions to their problems.

The phrase “in the way he should go” can be viewed in two ways. The bible in John 14:6 says that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life; no one goes to the father except through him. An understanding we get from this concept is that Jesus leads to the father. Without Jesus, nobody can get to the father. Parents should emphasize to their children that whatever they accomplish on earth is nothing compared to the length of time they will spend in eternity. Parents should help the children to understand the importance of personal and family altars. The place of personal altar is a place where God meets with the person. Another thing a parent should teach the child is that there is a way a Christian is expected to live that is different from the life styles of unbeliever. Colossian 2:6 says that as “As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him”. Therefore, the child is expected to pattern his or her lifestyle after good Christian values.

Another way to look at the phrase “in the way he should go” is that parents should teach their children to choose the right path. A parent should help the child to choose the career path that fits his/her strength. The training a parent gives a child should be in keeping with his individual gift. Every child has a God given gift or talent; every child has a destiny to fulfill; every child has a purpose to accomplish. Parents must ensure that the training the child gets will help him or her maximize destiny.

The way a parent will raise a strong will child is different from the way a parent will raise a child that finds it easy to follow instructions. You have to research all temperaments that your children have. A parent has to know how to motive strong willed children and children who are compliant. Every temperament has its strengths and weaknesses; one is not better than the other. It is the duty of the parent to identify the strength and weakness of your child's temperament and mold them accordingly.

Once you can successfully help a child to identify the way God wants them to live and the benefits of the strengths and weakness of their temperament, when they are grown they will not depart from these ways. They will not depart from your teaching because they know how to live and they can discern right from wrong and as a result, they will never be lost.

**A**s we all look forward to new things this year, one of the new things some are looking at is going into business. However, to succeed in anything, one needs to plan. Luke 14:28 (NIV) “Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won’t you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? Consequently, an issue that needs to be considered is the mode of carrying on the business – whether it is event management, catering or IT – you need a vehicle. The law recognizes certain modes of carrying on business and we will do a quick run through of some of the more common ones below:

**Sole proprietorship** – This is doing business in your personal capacity – and is the most common vehicle used by many to start business. This may be because a sole proprietorship is easier to set up with few legal requirements. Under a sole proprietorship, liability is that of the owner in full, and it is unlimited. This means if the business fails or there is a claim against the business, the proprietor bears the loss fully. The owner, not the business pays tax on their profits and the business is tied to the life and decisions of the proprietor. Also, the proprietor is the ‘Management’ so ownership and control are tied together. Unlike in the Corporation, where ownership and control are separate.

**Partnership** – When two or more persons, whether individuals or corporations, carry on business together with a view to profit, the relationship is called a partnership, and the members of the partnership are called partners. A partnership is like a sole proprietorship in that it is relatively inexpensive to set up, there are few legal formalities required to create it, and the partners carry on the business themselves directly, since the partnership is not a legal entity separate from its partners. The laws of Ontario recognize three types of partnerships: general partnerships, normally just called partnerships; limited liability partner

ships (LLPs); and limited partnerships. In Ontario, general partnerships and

LLPs are governed by the Partnerships Act whereas limited partnerships are subject to the requirements of the Limited Partnerships Act.

The income or loss of the business carried on by a partnership is determined at the partnership level and then allocated to the partners. The partnership vehicle itself is not taxed, the law provides that the income of a partner is calculated as though the partnership was a separate person. Every partner is an agent of the firm, and of their co-partners, and can bind the partnership by their actions.

**Corporation** – The Company is a legal entity distinct from its members. It has legal personality and is considered an artificial person. It is capable of enjoying rights, and subject to duties different from the members i.e. the shareholders. The shareholders do not own the company, they only own their shares in the company and their liability is limited only to the value of the shares held in the company. Members are not liable for the company’s debts - only the company is liable for the obligations incurred on its behalf.

Typically, businesses start up as sole proprietorships and over the years as the business expands may evolve into a corporation. Deciding on which vehicle to use is a balance of several factors including cost and business objective. The important thing is seek proper advice and be guided accordingly.

By His grace, we will all enter into a place of abundance this season in Jesus mighty name.

**T**he path to a successful life can be summarized in this statement by Peter F. Drucker which says, “If you want something new, you have to stop doing something old”. Sometimes success is not about sticking to what has worked for you or other people; it’s about finding a new way to get a better result. We have used about 36 days from 365 days in 2020 (as at the time of writing). Like every other year, we start with lots of expectations, but as the year winds down so does our faith and hope. How does that make you feel? Can you feel the joy that has brightened your face with a smile? Can you see others telling you, “Wow, I am so proud of you”, “You finally did it”! See those smiles on the faces of your friends, family and even your enemies. Take a moment to let this imagery sink in. Hmm, I can see those excuses and doubts that have held you back in previous years rearing its ugly head. But wait, whatever those limiting thoughts (doubts and excuses) are just remember this – Ecc. 9:4 says, “... for a living dog is better than a dead lion”. You may have had failures in the past, or you may feel you have not been given a fair opportunity like others you know. However, I can tell you this - you are still better off than most people. For one, you are still alive! There is more to come from you no matter where you have fallen from or to. Job 14:8-9 says, “For there is **HOPE** for a tree, if it is cut down, that it will sprout again, and that the shoots of it will not cease nor fail, though its roots grow old in the earth and its stump dies in the dry soil, yet at the **SCENT OF WATER**, (the stump of the tree) will flourish and bring forth branches and shoots like a seedling”. You can still be a success if you press on against all odds. Pressing on against all odds is an attitude I call a consistent persistent attitude, the-never-say-never-attitude.

In the Bible, a story was recorded in Judges 20 which displays a consistent persistent attitude. In this story, the 11 tribes of Israel were to war against the tribe of Benjamin over an abomination that was done (See Judges 19 and 20:1-17). The 11 tribes of Israel went to the house of God to inquire for God’s direction saying, “Which of us shall go up first to battle against the children of Benjamin?” and God replied them, “Judah first” (Judges 20:18). Having heard this, the children of Israel went out full of faith to win the battle, but **TWICE** they were defeated by the tribe of Benjamin. After each of those painful defeats, they went back to God weeping but God told them, “Go up against them” (Jud.20:19-28).

Now this story sounds so much like what we experience in our lives today. At some point in our lives, we have heard of God’s promises. Some of us even had dreams, revelations, words of knowledge etc. We have all the proof that this word or dream can only be God leading us in the right direction to be blessed at the end. Maybe, your pastor spoke those dreams/desires into your life, yet again confirming what God had placed in your heart. Some people you know got their blessings. You tried your best and even put in more works of faith than they did, however, for all your efforts, you were met with defeats and disappointments. However God is still saying to you, “Go for it, you will be a success”. Beloved, I know it is hard to consistently experience failure and remain strong because Proverbs 13:12 says, “Hope delayed makes the heart sick ...” However, the second part of this verse says, “...but when the desire comes, it is a tree of life”. This means it is refreshing experiencing success because the heaviness is taken away and you feel alive again. Your desires won’t come when you give up - you’ve got to find out new ways to succeed if the old ways aren’t working.

The story in Judges 20 continues. Verse 29 of Judges 20 records the third time Israel went back to fight the same battle they had lost twice, after hearing God say victory was theirs three times. By the third time, Israel finally got the victory they hoped for. While studying this story, I asked the Holy Spirit why Israel experienced defeats even after God told them victory was theirs. The Holy Spirit made me understand that something was different in their third attempt. The difference I found was that they changed their strategy the third time. This change came about because of a consistent persistent attitude. Someone once



said, "Insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results." If the 11 tribes of Israel had given up after their first or second failures, they wouldn't have seen the victory they hoped for. But a consistent persistent attitude kept them going until they saw the victory God promised them.

Have you tried something different? Those dreams, goals and desires you planned to accomplish this year in 2020 can still be done irrespective of your failures in the past. Look ahead in expectation; seek knowledge on how to become more efficient. I have experienced failures in the past, but I held on to what I hoped for as I tried different (legitimate) ways to succeed. I didn't give myself any room to lament over failures, I just press on! About 21 years ago in my second year at high school, my class teacher who got a better job offer gave the class a speech as he said his goodbye to the class. During his speech, he gave a quote that has resonated with me since. It goes like this:

"I perspire to acquire my desire which I admire not to retire but re-fire and perspire to acquire the desire which I admired."

Consistent persistent attitude is what you need. The will or promises of God do not automatically come to pass. We need our faith and actions working in line with God before we get blessed. Doubting and limiting thoughts will kill your desire and make you give up easily. If you can constantly overcome your doubts and limiting thoughts, the sky is just a starting point. It's

not up to God alone to act, you have to cooperate with Him in faith.

Therefore, get up and push on. Don't quit, read books, keep the right positive company so you can find out areas to improve and be better in, with a consistent persistent attitude. Your success is already guaranteed in Christ (Eph.1:3, 2 Pet.1:3), but it's your responsibility to experience your success through a consistent persistent attitude. You can do it because God has made provision for your success. It's the doubts and limiting belief you have kept within yourself (in your mind) that has held you down for too long. God knew you would experience all the setbacks you had in the past (or presently), but has made a way of escape for you. 1 Cor.10:13 (MSG) says, "No test or temptation that comes your way is beyond the course of what others have had to face. ALL YOU NEED TO REMEMBER IS THAT GOD WILL NEVER LET YOU DOWN; HE'LL NEVER LET YOU BE PUSHED PAST YOUR LIMIT; HE'LL ALWAYS BE THERE TO HELP YOU COME THROUGH IT." He is not the problem, Satan is. So, take your authority in Christ, resist Satan and he will flee! Press on with that dream; I believe you can make it this year in 2020. Stay blessed!

On the Award is inscribed the following: "In appreciation for your Acts of Kindness to pay it forward to support and empower vulnerable members of our community".

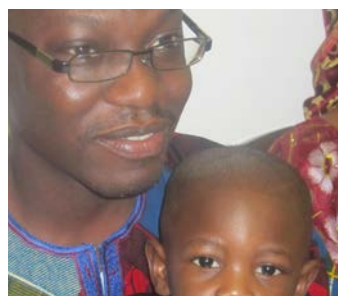

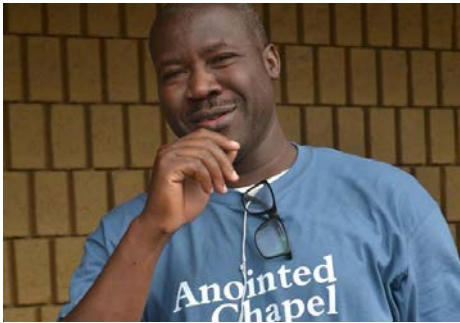

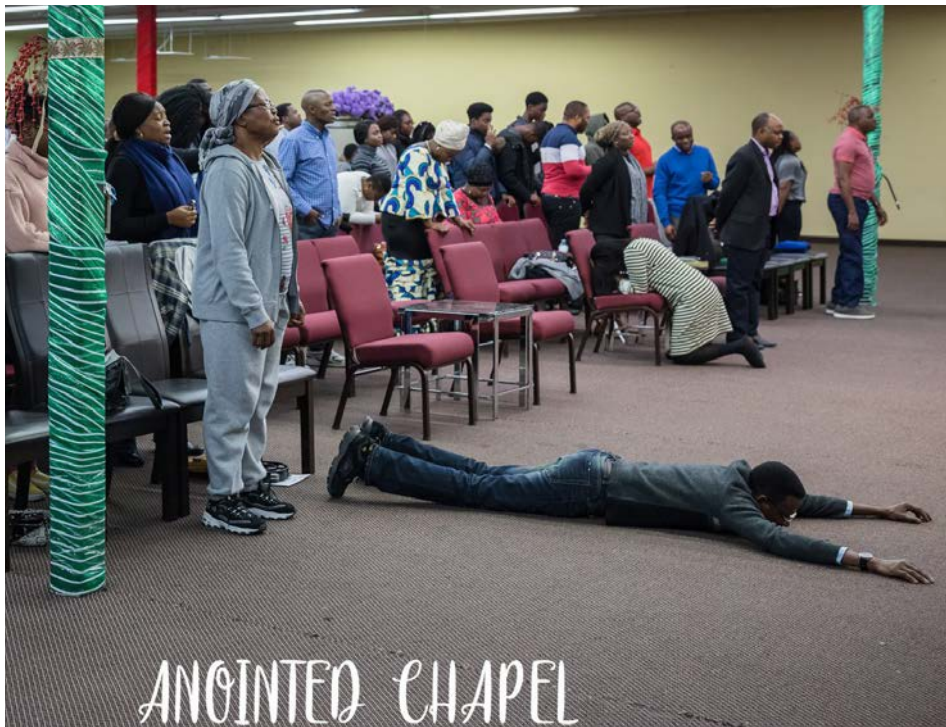

# THE CHURCH & POLITICAL INTEGRATION IN CANADA

**T**he Church plays a vital role in the lives of people who are seeking to build a relationship with God and find a balance in life. People seek solace in the word of God as exemplified by teachings from the pulpit. The Church is seen as the link between God, the People and the Society, thereby, providing the platform for the congregants to express their spiritual essence while ensuring that they evolve as good members of the community. The Church is a community within the larger community. That people identify more with the Church than the community cannot be overruled.

The Church plays an important role in community cohesion. This is important because we live in an increasingly multi-cultural and multi-religious society. Christians believe that the Church can be a stabilising force for good in a world that is increasingly unreligious. The Church do support people who are going through difficulties, whatever background they may come from. Just as the Church is a socio-economic stabilizing factor, the Church also is in the position influence the political order of the society. The Bible itself recognises political authority.” Everyone must submit to governing authorities. Political participation offers a direct mechanism for voicing concerns and interests, and for joining with others to bring into place needed changes at the community level; it also provides an important indirect mechanism for change by providing opportunities for selecting elected representatives who can voice those concerns and interests in turn” (The Political Integration of Immigrant and Visible Minority Women; Brenda O’Neill, Elisabeth Gidengil and Lisa Young).

As already established, the Church serves as the link between the People and the Community, this confers on the Church the responsibility of encouraging political participation by its members. The Church should help its immigrant members to shake off their minority awareness. A lot of political inactivity is caused by Immigrants can be traced to apathy which in turn links up with economic struggles to meet up with their daily life needs. It is expedient on the part of the Church to use the Pulpit to create and sustain political awareness for it members.

The Church itself needs to strategically position itself within the community for its be sought after as an influencing factor in the polity of the Community. Doing this will require the Church to have programs that have direct impact on its immediate Community. In addition to winning souls, the Church should focus on winning elective offices through the active participation of its members. This will ensure government programs and policies will reflect God’s plans for His children. It is the civic responsibility of every citizen to choose to seek elective offices as enshrined in the Constitution. While politicians approach the Church to seek votes, the Church also should identify and encourage its members with political inclination. Now is the time for the Church have a say in the political activities of their communities, failure to do this will have everyone accept and live with a system they refuse to identify with. Canada being a multi-cultural society, does not limit or restrict how far an Immigrant can go in politics. Political integration of Church members by the Church is a task that has to be embraced.





## MAKING A PLAN TO BE DEBT-FREE

### Step 1: Identify Your Debts

**S**tart with identifying what you owe. Create a list of all your debts. For each one, list the total amount you owe, the minimum monthly payment and the interest rate. Your list may include mortgages, car loans, credit card balances, line of credit balances, payday loans, taxes you owe, buy now, pay later balances, unpaid utility bills (cell phone, hydro, cable, etc.), student loans, loans from friends and family and spousal support and/or child support you owe

### Step 2: Review your budget

A budget is a plan that helps you manage your money. It will help you:

- Figure out how much money you get, spend and save
- Balance your income with your regular expenses
- Guide your spending to help you reach your financial goals

### Step 3: Decide on a strategy

Once you have created a list of all your current debts, begin your plan. The types of debt and the amount of debt you owe will affect your strategy for paying them off.

### Step 3a: Choose a timeframe

Set a payment timeframe that is reasonable, yet still affordable. If your timeframe is too long, you may lose focus due to a lack of progress. You'll also end up paying more money in interest. If your timeframe is too short, you may not be able to keep up with your payments. You may start to feel it's unrealistic to continue. Keep in mind, if interest rates rise, your monthly payments may increase.

### Step 3b: Decide which debts to pay off first

Depending on the type of debts you owe, it may be best to pay off certain debts first.

- Debts with high interest rates – By paying off the debts with the highest interest first, you'll pay less interest. This will help you become debt-free sooner. List your debts in order from the highest interest rate to the lowest. Make the minimum payments on all your debts. Then use any extra money to pay down the debt with the highest interest rate. For example, payday loans often carry the highest interest rates of any debts you may owe, followed by credit cards.
- Debts with the lowest balance – You may find it's easier to start with your debt with the lowest balance. You'll feel the accomplishment of paying off a debt sooner. This can keep you motivated to maintain your goal of becoming debt-free. However, this option may cost you more in interest over time.

### Step 3c: Make a plan to pay back your family or friends

If you have a personal loan with family or friends, talk to them about the money you owe. Commit to a payment schedule that works for you and the person who lent you money. You may want to consider writing post-dated cheques or setting up automatic money transfers in order to stick to the payment plan. This will also show that you're committed to repaying them.

### Step 3d: Work directly with your creditors and your financial institution

Contact your creditors to discuss your financial situation with them directly. Your creditors are the companies you owe money to. They may offer:

- a lower interest rate on your debt
- to extend your payments over a longer period of time and reduce your minimum monthly payment
- to consolidate your debts into one loan

### Step 3e: Close accounts on debts you have paid off

Once a debt is paid, consider closing that account. Only keep what you need and can manage responsibly. However, you should keep an older account open as your credit score is based partially on how long you have had credit, also known as your credit history. Closing all of your older credit accounts can make your credit history seem shorter than it actually is and can hurt your credit score. You may also want to consider using a secured credit card instead of a regular credit card. A secured credit card requires you to leave a deposit with the credit card issuer as a guarantee and you can only spend to that limit.

### Step 4: Consolidate your debts

You may consider applying for a loan or line of credit to pay off multiple debts with high interest rates. This is usually called consolidating your debts. Consolidating your debts means you'll only have to make one monthly payment rather than paying each of your debts individually. A consolidation loan or line of credit may help you get out of debt if:

- it has a lower interest rate than the debts you are consolidating
- it has a lower monthly payment than all your other debts put together as you can put the extra money toward paying down your debt faster
- you avoid taking on more debt with the available credit you free up

If you're considering a consolidation loan, make sure to ask your financial institution which type of debts you'll be able to pay off. Be careful to not to use the credit that you have freed up with your consolidation loan. If you do, then you will have even more debt than before.

### Step4a: Paying back a consolidation loan

Making the minimum payment on a consolidation loan will help you get out of debt eventually. However, the minimum payment on a line of credit will usually only cover the interest that you owe. You won't get out of debt if you only pay this amount. Increase your payments if you can to help reduce

your debt faster and pay less in interest. A consolidation loan won't hurt your credit rating if you make your payments on time.

### Step4b: Eligibility for a consolidation loan

A financial institution doesn't have to provide you with a consolidation loan. To be eligible, you must have an acceptable credit score and enough income to make monthly payments.

Step4c: Shop around for a consolidation loan

Be aware that some companies may offer consolidation loans with interest rates that are higher than the debts you are trying to consolidate. Make sure to shop around when you're trying to consolidate your debt. Different financial institutions may offer you different interest rates depending on the type of product you choose. For example, you may pay less interest on a line of credit than on a consolidation loan. If you shop around for a consolidation loan, make sure you do so within a period of two weeks, so that it doesn't affect your credit score.

### Step5: Avoid taking on more debt

Don't take on more debt. If you continue to spend more than your income, it will be difficult to become debt-free. If you're considering borrowing more money, take a close look at how it would impact:

- your existing debt payments
- your budget
- your ability to save for other goals
- You're at risk of no longer being able to manage your debt if:
  - you're already having trouble making your debt payments
  - you're close to your credit limit and would have trouble making higher payments if interest rates increase

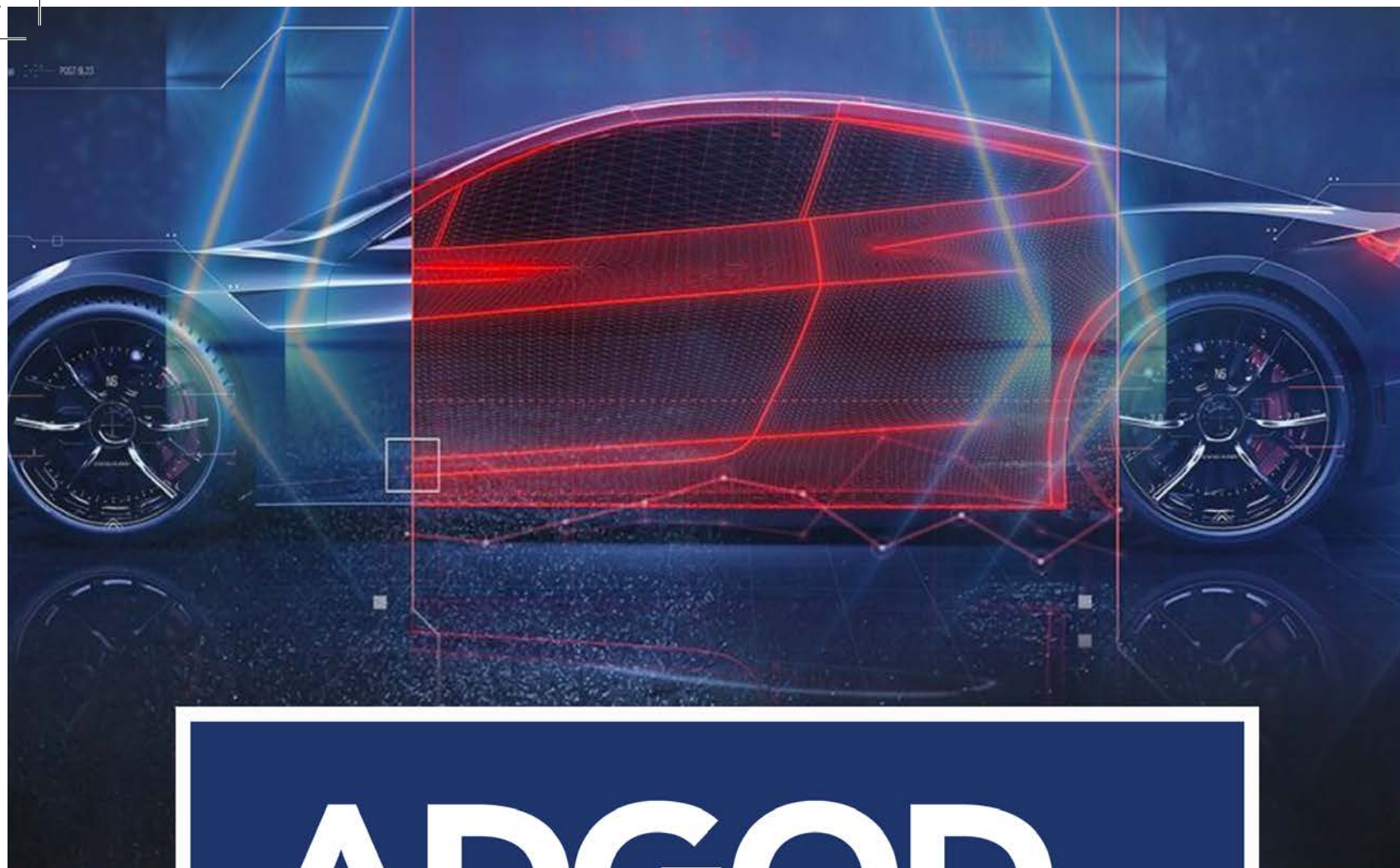
